Re: Call for Nominations: David Glick Lecture Award and Paul Nakane Prize at ICHC2025

Dear officials of the IFSHC member societies,

I hope this message finds you well. We are pleased to announce the call for nominations for two prestigious awards: the David Glick Lecture Award and the Paul Nakane Prize. These awards will be presented at the upcoming International Congress of Histochemistry and Cytochemistry (ICHC2025), which will take place in Rimini, Italy, from August 27-30, 2025.

The David Glick Lecture Award, established in 1982 by an anonymous donation, honors the contributions of David Glick. This award is presented at each International Congress of Histochemistry and Cytochemistry to a prominent histochemist or cytochemist. In recognition of David Glick's pioneering work in quantitative histochemical methods, we especially welcome nominations of individuals whose contributions have significantly advanced the field of quantitative histochemistry. The award includes a \$1,000 honorarium, up to \$2,000 to cover travel expenses, and a scroll or certificate to mark the award. The Paul Nakane Prize in Histochemistry and Cytochemistry is intended as a lifetime achievement award, honoring an individual who has demonstrated outstanding international leadership in advancing the fields of histochemistry and cytochemistry. The prize includes a plaque and a \$1,500 honorarium.

The recipients of these two awards will be requested to give a plenary lecture at ICHC2025.

We invite you to submit nominations of individuals who you believe are deserving of these honors. Please include a brief description of the nominee's contributions in the field. The past recipients of the awards are listed in the IFSHC web page (<https://ifshc.com/awards/>).

Nominations should be sent to me via email by October 31, 2024.
